Minister launches major initiatives to modernise India's maritime infrastructure, strengthen its global trade presence and promote sustainability

MUMBAI, March 3

THE Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways, Mr Sarbananda Sonowal, on Thursday launched a series of major initiatives of the Ministry aimed at modernising India's maritime infrastructure, strengthening its global trade presence and promoting sustainability during a stakeholders meeting in Mumbai to discuss the various possibilities arising from the key announcements made in the Union Budget for the maritime sector.

The Minister launched the One Nation: One Port Process (ONOP) initiative to standardise and streamline operations across India's major ports. This step aims at removing inconsistencies in documentation and processes that led to inefficiencies, increased costs and operational delays.

He also launched Sagar Ankalan — the Logistics Port Performance Index (LPPI) for FY 2023-24, as a significant step towards enhancing efficiency and global competitiveness in India's maritime sector.

Said Mr Sonowal on the occasion: With the launch of One Nation, One Port Process and Sagar Ankalan - LPPI Index, India is taking a decisive step towards standardised, efficient and globally competitive ports. By enhancing port

Our commitment to modern, green and smart port infrastructure will not only fuel economic resilience but also ensure a sustainable maritime future for generations to come. This is a transformative leap towards making India a maritime powerhouse, contributing to 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' and a developed India by 2047.

Bharat Global Ports Consortium

The Minister also launched Bharat Global Ports Consortium to strengthen global trade by expanding India's maritime reach and enhance its global trade resilience. In addition, he launched the MAITRI logo (Master Application for International Trade and Regulatory Interface) with the aim to streamline trade processes, reduce bureaucratic redundancies and expedite clearances, reinforcing India's commitment to ease of doing business.
