## Consortium of public firms to operate global ports under Bharat Ports Global

MUMBAI, March 4 **PORTS**, Shipping and Waterways Minister Mr Sarbananda Sonowal last week in Mumbai unveiled the ambitious **Bharat Ports Global**, a consortium of public sector companies that will bid for international opportunities and increase India's heft in the global maritime economy. He said that by developing robust port infrastructure, the Bharat Global Ports consortium initiative will streamline logistics, strengthen supply chains and support the 'Make in India' initiative by boosting exports. Bringing together India Ports Global (IPGL), Sagarmala Development Corporation (SDCL) and Indian Port Rail and Ropeway Corp. (IPRCL), the consortium will drive port expansion, operations and financing to

position India as a key player in international trade and logistics. IPRCL is a joint venture between 11 central governmentowned ports and Railways PSU Rail Vikas Nigam Ltd, which will look at infrastructure development. IPGL will handle operations, while SDCL, which is on route to becoming a maritime-dedicated NBFC, will facilitate the financing needs of the consortium, as per a report.
